## 2023 Introduction to Grant Writing

November 13, 2023 - February 5, 2024

BVGH will host a 10-session digital lecture series focused on essential grant writing concepts and tailored to meet the needs of clinicians and researchers in low- and middle-income countries (LMICs). This digital lecture series will cover several topics prioritized by our LMIC partners:

Lecture Series Part 1: Foundational grant writing concepts. Experienced clinicians and researchers discuss all relevant sections of common grant applications as well as how to find relevant funding opportunities, assess their suitability, and understand the target audience. Participants are encouraged to submit a writing sample before the course starts (e.g. section of a previous grant or of a grant in preparation) for anonymous review during a lecture.

Lecture Series Part 2: Gaining the perspective of reviewers and funders. Experts share what funders are looking for and recommendations by grant reviewers.

Optional Peer Review Workshop after the lecture series. Each participant writes a practice grant based on a selected scenario and uses a rubric to review one peer's practice grant. This exercise aims to help participants create useful materials for their future grant applications.
